Remember that prescription processing has this general workflow to ensure patient safety by increasing efficiency and reducing the chance of error

Retail Pharmacy Workflow

Drop off of Rx → Order Entry → Filling → Verification → Pickup

Institutional Pharmacy Workflow

Physician Order Entry → Pharmacist Verification of Order Entry → Filling → Pharmacist Verification → Medication Pickup
